CHRISTOPHER NOLAN: A RETROSPECTIVE WITH TONY MCKIBBIN + SCREENING: OPPENHEIMER

Christopher Nolan is perhaps Hollywood's best known and certainly one its most successful directors. His films make more money than Tarantino's and his imprint is more fashionable than Spielberg's. Yet in its own way, Nolan's work is demanding, as he rarely departs from registering the complications of time, often layering his stories through flashbacks and parallel chronologies. It leaves the viewer playing catch-me-up with more than just the details of the story. We will discuss the strengths and limitations to such an approach, and how his interest in puzzle-narratives coincided with other filmmakers whose work became popular in the mid-1990s and into the early 2000s.

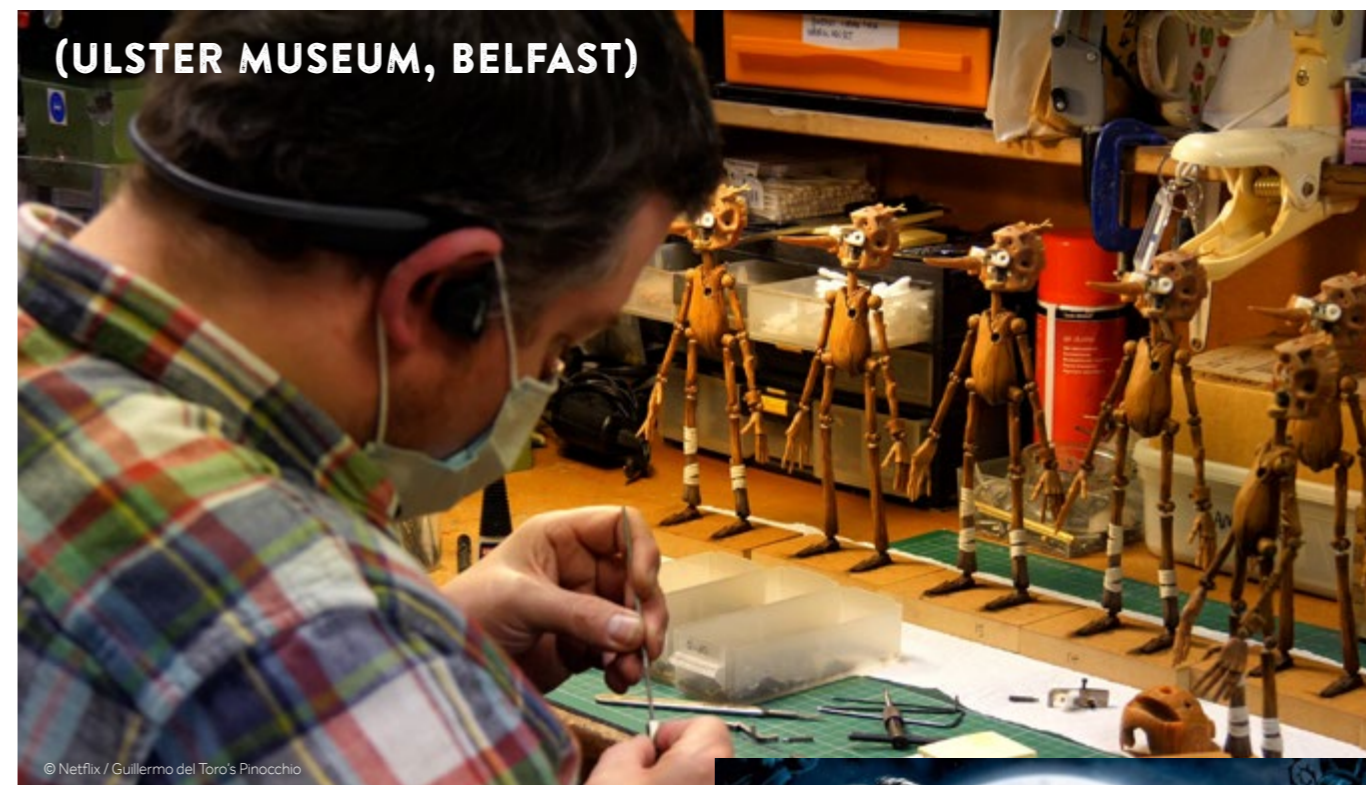

Richard is currently a Workshop supervisor and Senior armature maker at Mackinnon and Saunders Ltd, an internationally acclaimed company famous for creating award winning animation puppets for film, television, and commercials. His resume includes Tim Burton's *Corpse Bride* and *Frankenweenie*, Wes Anderson's *Fantastic Mr Fox*, *Coraline* and Guillermo del Toro's *Pinocchio*. During the 23 years he has worked in the industry, he has learnt a broad spectrum of design and construction techniques and has specialised in engineering body armatures and head

mechanics for stop motion puppets. In recent years he has been heavily involved with projects which have combined traditional making techniques with new 3-d printing technologies.

FRAMESTORE Q&A WITH NATHAN McCONNEL
+ SCREENING: GUARDIANS OF THE GALAXY VOL. 3

Nathan's varied career has seen him work on over 20 feature films, including the Oscar-winning *The Golden Compass*, *Alice in Wonderland*, and the BAFTA-nominated *Children of Men*. Since taking on the role of Animation Supervisor at Framestore in 2011, he has worked on the critically acclaimed *Kingsman: The Golden Circle* and Marvel's *Thor: Ragnarok*. Nathan's work on the Academy Award-nominated *Doctor Strange*, bringing to life Strange's Cloak, received great acclaim. Further projects include *Spider-Man: Far from Home*, the action-packed *Wonder Woman 1984*, *Fantastic Beasts: The Crimes of Grindelwald*, where he led an animation team in testing and breathing life to new creatures for the film, and *Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3*.

Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3 - Still reeling from the loss of Gamora, Peter Quill rallies his team to defend the universe and one of their own - a mission that could mean the end of the Guardians if not successful.

IN CONVERSATION WITH JON SOPEL

From the steps of Downing Street to the inside of the White House press briefing room, Jon Sopel has spent four decades reporting on global events and interviewing the people who tried to shape them. This promises to be a fascinating Q&A with one of the UK's leading political news journalists.

After a distinguished career at the BBC, Jon Sopel left last year to become the presenter of the chart-topping daily news podcast, 'The News Agents' - which he co-hosts alongside Emily Maitlis and Lewis Goodall. His last job at the BBC was as the North America Editor, a post he held for nearly 8 years. In that time, he travelled on Air Force One, interviewed Barack Obama and famously clashed with

President Donald Trump. He's reported from around the world and served as the BBC's Chief Political Correspondent. He has also presented all the main news programmes on radio and television. He's written several books, including the bestseller *If Only They Didn't Speak English*.

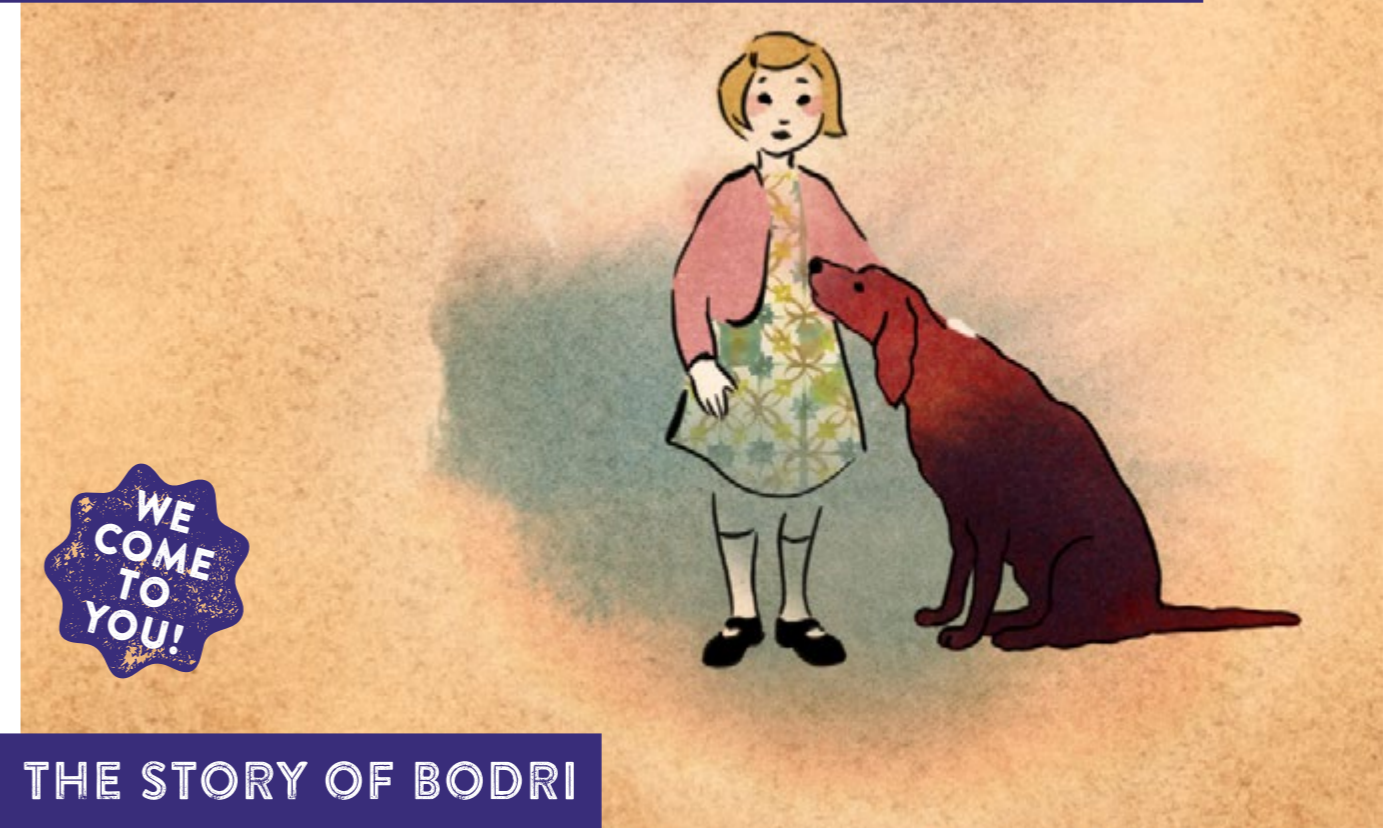

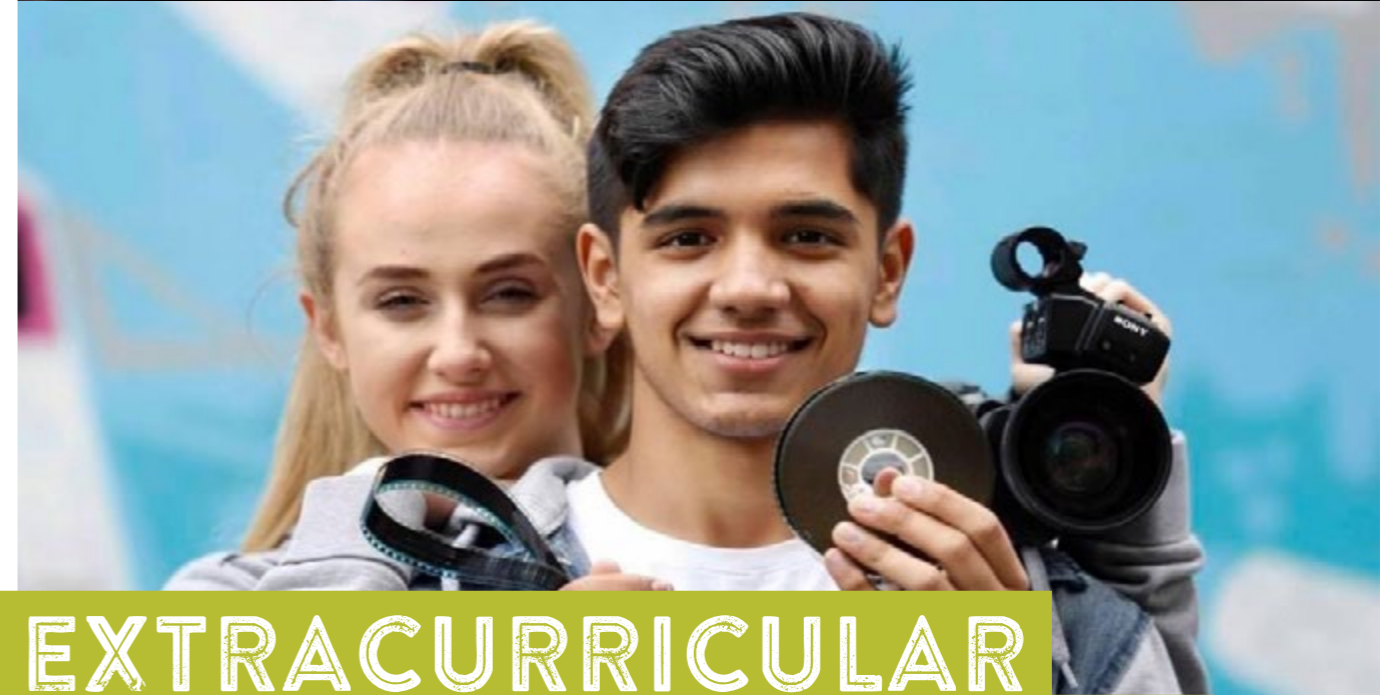
